Asian Development Bank: Japan Scholarship Program

- What: The Japan Scholarship Program provides an opportunity for well-qualified citizens of ADB's developing member countries to pursue postgraduate studies in economics, management, science and technology, and other development-related fields at participating academic institutions in the Asian and Pacific Region. The ADB-JSP provides full scholarships for one to two years.
- *Who:* Citizens of ADB's developing member countries, not older than 35 years old.

SEARCA Scholarships 2013-2014 for Master and PhD in Agriculture

- What: The Southeast Asian Regional Center for Graduate Study and Research in Agriculture (SEARCA) invites applications for its graduate scholarship (MS and PhD) in agriculture and related fields (including biological sciences, social sciences, economics and statistics, forestry and fisheries, environmental sciences, agro-industrial technology and engineering, biochemistry, and development management) for the academic year 2013-2014.

Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute (STRI)

What: STRI offers various fellowship opportunities:

Three-year Postdoctoral Fellowships in Tropical Biology

Research should be based at one of STRI's facilities, but proposals that include comparative research on other tropical countries will be considered. Deadline - January 15, 2012.

Short-Term Fellowships

Primarily for graduate students but awards are made occasionally to undergraduate and postdoctoral candidates. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in the tropics and explore research possibilities at STRI. The Ernst Mayr Fellowship is awarded to an outstanding short term fellowship candidate on an annual basis. (deadlines: March 15, May 15, August 15 and November 15).

Short-Term Fellowships for Students in Latin America, especially Central America and Panama

Support is provided for short-term projects and internships. Candidates must be from universities in Latin America, particularly Central America and Panama. (deadlines: March 15, May 15, August 15 and November 15).

A. Stanley Rand Fellowship Program

Support is provided for short-term research in the tropics focused on animal behavior, natural history, evolutionary biology, plant and animal ecology and environmental monitoring. (deadlines: March 15, May 15, August 15 and November 15).

Who: Applicants are evaluated on their academic standing, scholarly qualifications, experiences, the



quality of the research project or study proposed and its suitability to Smithsonian collections, facilities, and programs.

ANSTI/DAAD Postgraduate Fellowships

- *What:* The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) a publicly funded, self-governing organization of the institutions of higher learning in Germany, promotes international academic exchange as well as educational co-operation with developing countries through a variety of funding and scholarship programs. DAAD cooperates with ANSTI by offering a number of in-region scholarships for Masters and PhD degrees.
- Who: Participants in the program must be from ANSTI member institutions and may not exceed the age limit of 36 years by date of nomination. Applicants may not apply for studies in their home countries. Fellowships, which cover fees, subsistence and international travel, are awarded to staff of ANSTI member institutions (<u>View ANSTI Members</u>) for postgraduate studies (MSc. or PhD) at African universities for staff development. Fellowships are awarded to sub-Saharan African nationals for studies outside the applicants' home countries.

Netherlands Organization for International Cooperation in Higher Education (NUFFIC): MENA Scholarships 2012

- What: The Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs funds the MENA Scholarship Program to enable mid-career professionals in the MENA region to participate in short courses in the Netherlands. The courses must relate directly to the individual's professional specialization in fields that include water management; agriculture, forestry, and fisheries; and others. About 120 scholarships are awarded annually.

- *What:* TWAS research grants are awarded to high-level promising research projects in biology, chemistry, maths and physics (not applied research) carried out by individual scientists or research units in the 80 S&T lagging countries (S&TLC) identified by TWAS.
- Who: Individual applicants must be nationals of developing countries, hold a PhD, be at the beginning of their careers, and hold a position at a university or research institution in one of the 80 S&TLCs. As a general rule, the grants are awarded to scientists under the age of 45.



Applying *research units* must be led by a renowned researcher who is a national of a developing country, who holds a PhD and who has good research experience. The research unit must operate within a university or a research institution in one of the 80 S&TLCs .

- Who: Any science, technology and innovation (ST&I) related research and development activity linked to the theme "Feeding 1 billion in Africa in a changing world" which has been undertaken within the last five years and shows measurable impact (potential or demonstrated) on agricultural development or rural livelihoods in Africa, is eligible. Entrants are required to submit an extended abstract (1000 2000 words) that clearly details the ST&I project.

Louis Malassis International Scientific Prize for Agriculture and Food 2012

- What: The prize aims to recognize individuals, or a group of individuals, for their exemplary and promising contribution in promoting innovation through research, development and capacity building in the North, South or in the Mediterranean, in order to improve food and agricultural systems sustainability as well as contribute to addressing food security and poverty reduction. There are two categories: Louis Malassis Distinguished Scientist and Louis Malassis Young Promising Scientist.
- *Who:* Candidates should be nominated by an organization or institution from any of the following categories: (a) Academic or research organization, public or private, (b) Civil society organization, (c) Private sector group (e.g., small/medium enterprises). A group nomination should consist of no more than three persons. Each nominee (and each member of a group, in the case of a group nomination) should meet the following criteria:
 - a. For the "Distinguished Scientist Prize" Category
 - Holds a PhD degree
 - At least 15 years of professional experience
 - Proven significant contribution in one or various fields covered by the Prize
 - b. For the "Young Promising Scientist" Category
 - Holds a PhD degree
 - At least 5 years of professional experience
 - Demonstrated potential in one or various fields covered by the Prize
 - Should be no more than 40 years old by 01 January 2012

When: Closing date is 16 July 2012
